2024 ABCCR CAMPING

This summer, we had 235 campers between Camp Christy and Camp White Memorial gather for camp in June and July. The theme for camp this year was "Made Alive in Christ," inspired by Ephesians 2:4-5: "But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved."

The campers had an unforgettable experience, brimming with adventure, worship, and spiritual growth. At Camp Christy, students can immerse themselves in a variety of activities, including a spacious playground, scenic hiking trails, a fire pit, frisbee golf course, tetherball, volleyball, and a basketball court. Additionally, they have access to a rock-climbing wall, swimming pool, and airsoft course, ensuring there's never a dull moment.

At White Memorial, students can dive into a wide range of outdoor activities that allow everyone to experience new and exciting things; from zip lines, rock climbing walls, and giant swings to axe throwing, archery, fishing, hiking trails, a labyrinth, kayaking, volleyball, disc golf, and prairie surfing, there's an adventure for everyone. These activities are crafted to bring joy, develop skills, and create lasting memories in the beauty of the great outdoors.

Worship sessions were at the heart of the camp experience. Morning and evening gatherings were filled with powerful messages, uplifting music, and moments of deep prayer. The theme of being made alive in Christ resonated throughout, reminding everyone of the grace that sustains us even in our struggles. The campers were encouraged to embrace their new life in Christ and carry that joy into their daily lives. Spiritual formation was woven into every aspect of camp life. Through small group discussions, personal reflection time, and guided prayer, the campers delved deeper into understanding what it means to be alive in Christ.

Camp offering for this year was designated for Bethel Neighborhood Center. The students donated a total of \$1,408.84 for the Bethel Neighborhood Center in Kansas City, Kansas. This contribution will help support the center's mission to provide vital services and support to the local community.

As the camping season came to a close, campers left with full hearts, strengthened faith, and a deeper connection to Christ. The memories made, lessons learned, and friendships formed at Camp Christy and Camp White Memorial will undoubtedly last a lifetime, reminding each camper that they are truly made alive in Christ.

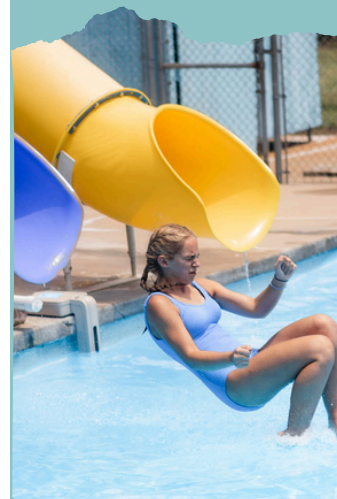

YOU ARE BEING WATCHED!

Rev. Dr. Bill Hendricks, Director of Interim Ministry

How does it make you feel, to know you're being watched? My first reactions include fear and anger. What right has been given to 'someone' (or anyone) to judge and criticize me? Immediately I fall into negativity and instinctively raise my 'Protection Mode Shield.' I have learned it over the years. Attack is what I see. On social media, click three times and stop, or you'll be bombarded with nasty bites.

My wife, Jacki has a refrigerator magnet that makes a difference when I think of it. It's pictured on the right. I am learning to bite less, someday I will snarl less as well. Watched! I suggest a different reaction, a new mode of living. One that's more positive and possibly one where fewer bites occur. Here are four ways the Interim Ministry program helps your church rethink being watched:

1st Positive Intent— Jesus serves Judas with the other disciples at the Last Supper. He's being watched. He lives knowing Judas is sitting at the table, the Feast of the Passover. Behind God's watching eyes surfaces a different perspective. There is no white stallion returning victorious from war. It's a man wearing sandals, riding a donkey! A savior! Jesus says sit and eat at my table. Although absolute love is difficult for me today, I can assume everyone's best intent. The presence of an interim says to your church. "Hold tight to Jesus. God will act. Don't bite when a simple growl will do."

2nd Healing— At Jesus' arrest, Peter put away his sword, but only after inflicting significant injury. Then healing occurs. The ear of Malcus is restored. Healing happens (John 18:10)! The Interim Minister sets the tone for healing to occur in your church as well. Are you hurting, come. Do you have concerns, come. Your voice is needed and wanted. The Interim offers a healing moment in your church. Jesus heals. Not a snarl or a bite.

3rd Confidence— Interims show up at your church knowing The life and future of your church is overseen by God. Confidence stems from life in Jesus. It is His ministry. God has been with us since the beginning. The Interim knows this is God's ministry. In a world filled with worry and criticism, God's got this! But Jesus is watching. Don't bite. The Interim arrives from Day One thinking, 'I'm here to serve and love, not control and fight.' An Interim knows their position is temporary and is not a jockey trying to capture the pole position.

4th Self-importance— The Interim serves, not seeking money or power. The Interim brings people alive in the church. The power shifts to getting members to join in, rather than fight to be heard. We shift to a church of relationship, together delivering a New Identity. A Body of Christ! The Interim says, "Someone will follow them soon who will be far more important to the church than themselves." "Thy will be done." A currently rudderless environment is being managed. Did you wonder why Jesus was never caught off guard? He was never off guard! Jesus understood His relationship with God. And an Interim Minister understands your church's relationships. The Interim arrives with no self-driving agenda. The Interim does not bite!

During the 65th anniversary of the Kansas Baptist Convention Foundation, I want to continue to remember, give thanks and celebrate the lives of our annuitants, who invested with the KBCF and have gone home to be with the Lord! In this article we will read and learn about the lives of the Fishers.

Dr. Glenn Fisher & Mrs. Marvel Fisher were annuitants with the KBCF, and while some of you may have known them well, I want to tell you and others more about them.

From 1943 to 1945, Dr Fisher was a member of the US Army Infantry (PFC). Part of D-Day and the Battle of the Bulge, Dr. Fisher was awarded the Purple Heart. He wrote a personal account of his service during WWII, which is entitled "Mine is Not the Reason Why—The Story of a One-Eyed Soldier" later in 2002.

Of course, this was not the only thing that he wrote, but I will get to that in a minute. Dr Fisher earned his doctorate degree in Economics from the University of Wisconsin in 1954. From there he went to the University of Illinois, where he became a full professor in political science. He collected data by hand from local government units in order to explain the variations between state and local expenditures. As a result of this, he wrote an article "Interstate Variation in State and Local Government Expenditure", which has been one of the most quoted articles in the National Tax Journal.

As the first Regent's Professor of Public Finance, Dr. Fisher began teaching at Wichita State University in 1970 until 1993. At that time he was named Regent's Professor Emeritus and continued to write and publish scholarly articles, while serving on the Consensus Revenue Estimating Group for the State of Kansas.

Professor Sam Yeager writes this about our annuitant, " In an active career spanning four decades, Dr Fisher's National reputation in state and local finance is well-known. In 2006, Dr Fisher received the highest award in public finance—the Aaron Wildavsky award from the Association for Budgeting and Financial Management of the American Society for Public Administration. His book, "The Worst Tax?" (1996) is a thorough and widely read historical account of the property tax. Dr. Bart Hildreth, a former colleague at Wichita State, credits Dr Fisher for the efficiency of property tax administration in Kansas."

Marvel Mirriam McFarlin Fisher and her three sisters spent most of their childhood in Mason City, Iowa. As a youngster, she learned to play the piano and sing, which created a great passion for music early in her life. In 1945, she graduated with a BA in nursing from the University of Minnesota.

She met Glenn Fisher at a Rodger Williams Fellowship gathering a year later and he became the love of her life. They were married in September, 1949, and had three children—Paul, Gary & Rhonda, and shared 69 years of love together. They spent 40 years in Wichita, Kansas, and lived abroad due to sabbaticals on several occasions and they enjoyed traveling extensively together. They also have four grandsons: Mark, Michael, Brandon and Justin, and a granddaughter-in-law, Kate.

In the 1970s, Marvel discovered the handbells through a choir at First Baptist Church of Wichita. Because of this she expanded her interest in music and learned to conduct the handbells and play bell solos. She was so intrigued by this musical instrument, she started a community choir, The Bells of Wichita in 1983 and she conducted several church choirs over the years.

Marvel also discovered a love and her passion for painting. She joined art clubs and got progressively better, winning numerous ribbons over the years. Even after they moved to a retirement center in Colorado in 2012, she didn't slow down as she continued to paint and started yet another bell choir at the retirement center there.

They lived full and productive lives, serving the lord, and the Kansas Baptist Convention Foundation is grateful that they became annuitants with us. Would you like to do the same thing? 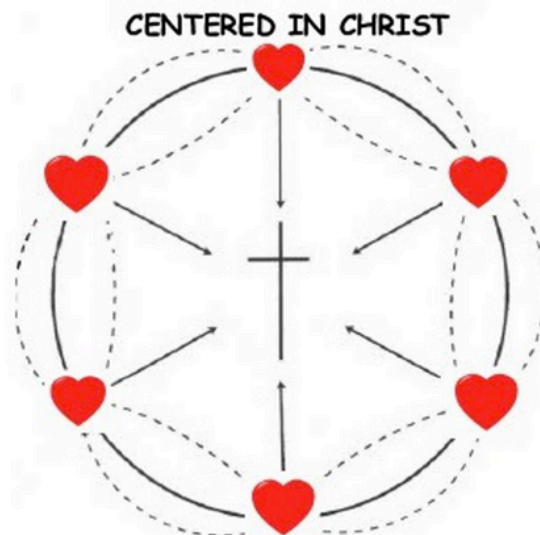
