# AB MEN REBUILDING PROJECT IN NORTH CAROLINA

Three AB Men represented the Central Region for Hurricane Helene rebuilding in partnership with National AB Men's Disaster Relief and Baptists on Mission. Paul Wood from First Baptist Church of Olathe, Mike Templin from Woodlawn Avenue Baptist Church in Wichita; and Dryden Powell from First Baptist Church of Council Grove traveled to Boone, North Carolina and joined 40 other volunteers from six different states the week of March 15 through March 21.

The three men were assigned to two different residential project sites working in a crawl space to insulate sub floors, plumbing and connecting sewer lines, removing old flooring and installing new flooring, and stabilizing floor joists. Central Region AB Men and Olathe First Baptist Church donated funds for travel costs. Rebuilding projects will continue in North Carolina and additional

work teams are encouraged to volunteer.

It's time to pay your taxes again by April 15th, unless you file an extension or possibly wish to have a visit from the IRS. Paying your taxes might be an easy process but for many it is a very detailed and daunting task to complete. Some would say that it is very taxing.

The word "taxing" is an adjective that means physically or mentally demanding.

With the federal tax code coming in at 6, 781 pages in length, one way to make your taxes less taxing would be to have them done by a company such as Kansas City's own, H&R Block or Liberty Tax Service, etc. You can also do them online using TurboTax or other online software to get the job done.

Another option would be to have an accountant do your taxes, such as Vonda Brecheisen, Wilma Engle or Harold Wolgast, just to name a few excellent accountants & tax preparers!! The only problem is that Vonda works for a firm and is semi-retired and Harold is definitely retired. Wilma, our previous director of planned giving, still does some taxes, but I don't think she is taking on new clients. So you'll just have to look online or find someone by word of mouth if you need an accountant.

When I was in high school, we had a semester class called "consumer education" where we learned a lot of important things like how to buy a used car, how to make a budget and how to pay your taxes, and I learned a lot of helpful things in that class. Of course, paying my taxes was much easier then because I just had a W-2 from my fast food restaurant job and some supplemental farm income from raising hogs. When you are an ordained minister, your taxes are much more complicated! Fortunately for me, my colleague and mentor in ministry, Rev. Dr. Jan Hazekamp, who was the American Baptist campus minister at Illinois State University, sat down with me and showed me how to do all of the extra schedules that I would need to do in order to pay my taxes. I am very grateful for that tutoring because I have been able to do my taxes every year since then. Of course, you still have to keep up with the new tax forms and laws, but It can be done. I don't know about you but I always feel a sense of release and peace when I get my taxes done. Then I just hope that I won't get any letters or visits from the IRS. Well I have gotten a few letters from them, but I have not had a visit from them yet.

Now I am going to take a little creative and poetic license here in relation to the use of the word "taxing." I am thinking of the word as a verb to mean "paying less tax." In that sense, I have a very good suggestion to help you pay less tax. If you fund a charitable gift annuity, with yourself as the beneficiary, you will not only receive a financial payment for the rest of your life, but you will also receive an income tax deduction as well. If you want to use appreciated stock to fund your charitable gift annuity, you will still receive an income tax deduction, and you will also receive a capital gains tax deduction as well. That is a win-win situation! Plus you will still receive the gift payment back to yourself every year, if you are the beneficiary. Finally, when your time on earth is done, the remainder of your gift annuity will bless the foundation and the charity or mission partner of your choice. With all of these gift annuity options, you can definitely make your taxes less taxing.

While you will not be able to receive an income tax deduction for your 2024 tax, if you choose to fund a charitable gift annuity this year, you will receive an income tax deduction based on the amount of money that you give to fund the annuity. So, if you are interested in funding a gift annuity, please call, email or text me and I will get back with you right away to help you in this process that will make your taxes less taxing next year!

### DO YOU BELIEVE THIS?

"Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

John 11:25-26 NIV

Do you believe this? "Is that a rhetorical question Jesus?" If I were Martha, those words may have flown out of my mouth before I had time to stop and think about what I was saying. While we have this snapshot of her life, set in the context of her brother's recent death, it is a transformational moment for her. It is also a moment when Jesus of Nazareth makes another "I AM" declaration, thus proclaiming further evidence of his divine nature.

As we come near to the season of Easter and prepare to celebrate this year's Resurrection Sunday, I find myself seeing this passage through and entirely different lens. It is a lens that was created through the passing of two very important people in my life, my stepdad and my dad. Within a five-month span of time, both entered the eternal presence of their Lord and Savior Jesus Christ yet left a void for many on this side of Heaven.

While the above referenced text is very familiar to me, this year, when I read it, it takes on an entirely new meaning. It has become more than words spoken into a life that was grieving. It is more than words of comfort attempting to lessen the sting of mourning. This proclamation from the Son of God are words of hope.

Because of this life giving I AM statement, and belief in it, those who are now in the presence of The Resurrected Christ, and those of us who are still living on this planet, will one day be reunited. Death does not have the final word for those who believe. That is the hope. That is why we believe that Jesus Christ IS the Resurrection and the Life.

The truth and hope that are promised through the words of Jesus in John's gospel can be applied to any situation in our life that seems dim, without hope or unredeemable. While there may not have been a physical loss, there may be something else that has been lost. A loss that has created a season of grieving or mourning. Christ came to be the resurrection and life for those circumstances as well.

So, then, how shall we answer his question, "do you believe this"? Will we think it to be a rhetorical question, or will we take this opportunity to bear witness to an unbreakable promise of Jesus? Yes, Jesus, we do believe this. And because of our belief, we will one day see the faces and hear the familiar voices of those who are already living their everlasting life. Thanks be to God.
