## BETHEL NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER TO BE REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT AGENCY

Bethel Neighborhood Center has been a longstanding pillar of support for immigrants and refugees in the community for the last 100 years and has expanded on its mission to do justice, love mercy, and to walk humbly with God by preparing to fully utilize the newly renovated and expanded facilities, by building upon its mission of providing housing, healthcare, job training, and pathways to self-sufficiency for God's people. Bethel is preparing for its next major endeavor: becoming a resettlement agency for refugees.

With approval from the Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration (PRM)—the humanitarian arm of the U.S. State Department—Bethel will now play a pivotal role in resettling refugees in the Kansas City area. This designation is a significant step for the organization and the community it serves, allowing it to directly support incoming refugees.

In partnership with the International Rescue Committee (IRC), Bethel is preparing to welcome between 75 and 100 refugee families over the next year, starting in October 2024 through September 2025. These refugees will benefit from Bethel's commitment to creating a safe and nurturing environment during their first year in the United States.

To successfully carry out this mission, Bethel is calling on the local community for support in several ways:

- Volunteer Time: Volunteers are needed to assist with a variety of resettlement tasks.
- Furnish Apartments: Donations of household items will be used to prepare homes for incoming refugee families.
- Financial Donations: Monetary contributions will help sustain Bethel's expanded mission.
- Prayer: The center also encourages the community to offer prayers for the refugees and the success of the resettlement program.

The enhanced facilities and expanded mission align with Bethel's core value of engaging the lives of refugees and immigrants, offering them hope and practical assistance in building a new life. Those interested in participating in this effort can reach out to Bethel Neighborhood Center to learn how to get involved.

As Bethel Neighborhood Center steps into this new role, the organization continues its long-standing tradition of compassionate service, now with the additional opportunity to help refugee families achieve self-sufficiency in their new home.



REV. DR. ROBIN STOOPS



How many of you have ever heard of the radio broadcaster, Paul Harvey? I'm sure there are many of you who know who he is and some others who do not. He usually broadcasted the news on the radio every day around 11:30 a.m. or so and he also included interesting and unusual news stories of note. Still, he also had another radio program, that was probably 5 minutes or less, which usually was broadcast just before 3:00 p.m. on weekdays. That program was called, "The Rest of The Story" and it always included an informative and fascinating story like the fact that the original Coca-Cola had a small hint of cocaine in it or the true story behind a Rembrandt painting or how Colonel Sanders came up with 11 herbs and spices for his fried chicken recipe, etc. What does this have to do with my article? Well, let's find out.


During our 65th anniversary year, as we take a look at the life of another couple who took out a charitable gift annuity with the Kansas Baptist Convention Foundation, we will learn more about the lives of Reverend Darrell & Mrs. Betty R. Heidner. That's where the rest of the story comes in! I was looking for their obituaries online and I didn't find much information, so I got a hold of their daughter, Ruth Clark, one of our gifted musicians in the local church and American Baptist leader throughout the denomination, and she helped me out by having her sister send me their individual obituaries.

While their obituaries had all of the important information in them, they were so short that there was not a good enough story in my opinion to share. I think the most important things that I gleaned from both of them is that they were married for 65 years and they have five children, 16 grandchildren and 7 great-grandchildren at the time of Betty R. (Wing) Heidner's death. (I need to state it that way because Rev. Darrell was married a second time to Betty Nettleton.) Rev. Darrell was born in New Effington, SD in 1924. He worked for the Santa Fe Railroad in KC, KS as he studied for Christian ministry. He pastored churches in Iowa and Nebraska before moving to Wichita in 1980, to serve as an area minister for the American Baptist Churches of the Central Region.

Being a farm boy myself, I felt like I needed more meat and potatoes or corn for this story, so I contacted Ruth again and she wrote an amazing, stream-of-consciousness piece about her parents. So I am going to share some excerpts from that now.

She writes, "Three things changed the course of his life in South Dakota. When he was 16, there was an accident in the field, and a horse fell on him, severely breaking his leg. He spent six weeks that summer in traction in the upstairs room of the local doctor's office. During that time, bored and restless, he began to read the New Testament seriously. While church was always a part of their lives, he had not previously given much thought to his relationship with the Lord.

Because of the accident, one leg was shorter than the other which did not allow him to serve in the military. Instead, he went with three others to Oregon and spent several months welding ships during World War II.



Finally, the allergies that had caused him problems since his early years convinced him that trying to stay on the farm was not his best health choice. He went to Minneapolis and learned how to be a railroad telegraph operator, cutting orders for trains. When he completed the training he was offered two positions— one in Arizona (probably because of his health concerns) and another in Kansas City, Kansas (much closer to South Dakota). So, he arrived early one morning at Union Station in Kansas City which, as one of his neighbors later claimed, "would hold a lot of hay!"

He found an upstairs sleeping apartment in the home of a Santa Fe engineer's widow in Argentine and went to work in the office. One of his coworkers, Allen Wing, took pity on the homesick young man and invited him to church and Sunday dinner at their home where he had a daughter named Betty.

Even though they proudly served cherry pie from their backyard tree (to which Darrell was seriously allergic), the dinner was a great success. Darrell began faithfully attending Argentine Baptist Church with Betty and her family and was baptized there. Engaged on New Year's eve, they were married there in June of 1948."

Their story continues—they continued to work at the church and helped with Youth for Christ. He felt a nudge toward ministry, so he began studying at Kansas City Bible College the same month that they welcomed their first daughter, Ruth. During bible college he was encouraged to do some preaching and served at Morse Community Church for several years. He held baby daughter Ruth in his arms while he led the singing and Betty played the piano during the first few months there. After Bible College, he still needed a few more credits so he studied at Kansas City Kansas Junior College. During this time they welcomed their second daughter Martha. Next, he studied at Central Baptist Theological Seminary and their son Paul was welcomed into the family as well. During his final 18 months of Seminary, he became the associate pastor at the First Baptist Church of Overland Park. He completed his Bachelor of Divinity degree in 1958 and was ordained by the First Baptist Church of Overland Park before becoming the pastor of the Merrill's Grove Baptist Church in rural Shelby County, lowa. During this time they welcomed their third daughter Rachel.

Ruth writes more— "On a January day in 1963 so cold and stormy that neither the current school nor the new school was open, they moved to Shenandoah, lowa, where he became the pastor of the First Baptist Church. They welcomed their fourth daughter Lois that June. That was when Betty announced, "since we have welcomed a new child with each new school or church, next time, we should get a dog!"

Seven years later, they moved to Omaha, Nebraska, to begin ministry with the Benson Baptist Church (no new children, but a new dog!) After ten years there, the Central Region called him to become the Area Minister for the South Central Area, and they moved to Wichita to begin that Ministry.

All during their marriage, Darrell was an avid and effective gardener. Betty learned to can and freeze the produce. It was an extension of that passion for growing – garden, churches and the Kingdom – that made them consider establishing annuities that would provide Christmas and anniversary gifts for each of their children. We continue to enjoy the blessings of their thoughtfulness each year." \*


