Attendees were led in worship sessions by the First Baptist Church of Lyon's worship team, which set a reflective and uplifting tone for the gathering. One of the key highlights was the keynote and workshop delivered by Rev. Dr. Steve Van Ostran, Executive Minister of ABC of the Rocky Mountains. In his workshop, he addressed the unique challenges bi-vocational pastors face and the benefits of having a bi-vocational pastor. During his keynote message, he expanded on the theme, "Fishing on the Other Side of the Boat," He challenged attendees to consider fresh perspectives in ministry and mission and emphasized the importance of opening the doors to welcome all people to come to know Christ.

Our other keynote speaker and workshop leader was Global Servant, Rev. Mercy Gonzalez-Barnes. She serves as a regional consultant in theological education and leadership development in Iberoamerica and the Caribbean, Mercy shared her experiences of teaching, mentoring, and walking alongside men and women in ministry. She spoke about her collaborative work with local leaders and Palmer Theological Seminary, making theological education accessible through online learning programs in Spanish, inspiring many with her dedication to nurturing leaders across the region.

Julia Stegeman led an engaging workshop on burnout, offering much-needed tools and strategies for managing stress and maintaining balance in ministry. Pastor Joel Grizzle, who serves as the senior pastor of FBC Lyons, KS opened the day on Saturday with a captivating devotion covering the story of Zacchaeus.

The event concluded with the installation of new officers, a meaningful time of communion, and special music that drew everyone together in worship and reflection. The gathering was an enriching experience for all, leaving participants spiritually refreshed and encouraged for the year ahead. How many of you have ever heard of the radio broadcaster, Paul Harvey? I'm sure there are many of you who know who he is and some others who do not. He usually broadcasted the news on the radio every day around 11:30 a.m. or so and he also iAs we continue to celebrate our 65th anniversary year of the Kansas Baptist Convention Foundation, I will take a look at another couple who invested with us and share their story here.

Pastor "Larry" & Mrs. Mabel Oyer were annuitants with the KBCF and their story is an interesting and captivating one as well. Lawrence Oyer was born on June 17, 1926, in the Concord community near Dodge City, Kansas. He attended schools in the area and graduated from Greensburg high school. From there he went on to study at Ottawa University, where he received his BA in 1954. He attended Central Baptist Seminary for 2 years and also studied at Emporia State University and earned his master of science degree from Fort Hays State University in 1965.

Larry was called to Christian Ministry and was licensed to preach at the North Ottawa Baptist Church in Ottawa, Kansas. He was ordained as an American Baptist minister in 1957, while serving at Stillwell Baptist Church in Stillwell, Kansas.

Mabel Marie Houser was born on November 3rd, 1926 in Dodge City, Kansas. She graduated from Dodge City High School in 1945. She was united in marriage to Lawrence "Larry" Oyer on August 21, 1949 in Dodge City, Kansas. Mabel & Larry raised three daughters: Marilyn Beth, Monta Jo and Marta Kay.

Mabel supported her husband, Larry, in Christian pastoral ministry and led in women's & children's ministry. That ministry included pastoring in many churches including: LaHarpe Baptist, Bethel Baptist, Hillsdale Presbyterian, Belpre Baptist, Berean Baptist, Woodlawn Baptist in Wichita and Bethany Baptist in Bentley, Kansas.

Larry also served in a variety of roles at American Baptist camps throughout the years. He devoted hours of his time and lots of hard work to many construction projects for camps as well as for the American Baptist Men's Disaster Relief program.

Larry served the Lord in other ways, including the education field. He was an elementary school teacher and a school administrator. He began teaching at the Concord school near Dodge City, where his mother had attended and also taught school when Larry was a small boy. During his teaching career, he was involved in sports programs, building projects and community events.

Besides working in the home as a mother and wife, Mabel worked for the Woolworth Co. in Dodge City, Montgomery Ward in Newton, and later the JCPenney Co. in Wichita until her retirement in 1988. She loved flower gardening and collecting dolls, windmills and piggy banks. She enjoyed traveling and more importantly, spending time with family and friends!

Larry loved antique cars and owned and restored a 1931 Model A, 1926 Model T and a 1953 Crestline Victoria. He enjoyed participating in car clubs and antique car tours.

For nearly half a century, Larry and Mabel served the Lord in every way they knew how. Most often it meant building something like a family, congregations, ministries, churches and homes.

As I reflect on this personally, this makes completely good sense as Larry and Mabel were part of "the builders" generation or as my late mom's favorite, former news anchor, Tom Brokaw, would say, they are part of "the greatest generation!" Of course, Larry & Mabel, like all of you, have built on a firm foundation of faith in Jesus Christ, our lord and savior!!

They both also built on a solid financial foundation by funding a charitable gift annuity through the Kansas Baptist Convention Foundation, which provided them both a stream of income for the rest of their lives and monetary donations to the mission partners of their choice, after they went home to be with the Lord. As I conclude this story of the Oyers, I hope that each of us are grateful for all those who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith!



As we begin the month of October, let us pray for the world mission offering that supports all of our IM missionaries around the globe and the important, life-changing and magnificent work that they do throughout our world.




Might we all pray and work together to accomplish God's mission here on earth. This reminds me of I M's theme scripture for the work that they are doing now, "on earth as it is in heaven."
