Part of a great tradition

George and Hannah Liele, former slaves who began self-supported mission in Jamaica in 1782, are honored as the first Baptist missionaries from the United States. In 1814 the movement now known as IM was formed to appoint and support Adoniram and Ann Judson, missionaries already serving in Burma. Our pioneer work in Burma (today called Myanmar) quickly spread elsewhere in Asia. It grew to include mission within Native American nations of North America as well as mission in Africa, Europe and Latin America. Today we serve in Asia, Africa, Europe, the Middle East, the Americas and the Caribbean.



What we are called to do

We take a holistic approach to mission, patterning our ministries on Jesus' example: inviting people to experience the fullness of God's love, while also meeting needs for healing and wholeness in other areas of life. We collaborate with our international partners in areas of service that include:

Evangelism

Inviting people to faith in Jesus, helping them form churches to unite under God's reign and coming together in God's mission of transforming all creation.

Anti-Human-Trafficking

Combating modern-day slavery through ministries of prevention, rescue and after-care that address physical, mental, spiritual, educational, relational and vocational needs.

Economic Development

Mentoring local leaders and helping people care for their families and contribute to their communities using expertise in agriculture, finance and technology to achieve short-term goals and long-term stability.

Health and Wellness

Helping people experience abundant life, including physical and mental wholeness, by training and serving alongside national medical professionals including doctors, nurses, therapists and preventive health care workers.

Peace and Refuge

Training individuals in skills of conflict transformation and assisting local workers in providing refuge to those displaced by violence, persecution or natural disaster.

Education

Providing education that reduces child labor, improves health, empowers local economies and enables people to read, make informed spiritual commitments and exercise leadership in their churches and communities.

Theological Education

Equipping pastors and the laity by working alongside national leaders to provide training in seminaries, Bible schools, pastoral institutes and non-traditional settings.
